

Burnham Beeches Walks

Walks likely to be suitable for people with impaired mobility and users of wheelchairs, mobility scooters and pushchairs



Burnham Beeches is a large area of ancient woodland open to the public and has been designated as a National Nature Reserve. It has been owned and managed by the Corporation of London since 1880. There are many miles of trails through the woodland and there is car parking, toilets and refreshments available.

Path Information

There are many paths with hard surfaces, including roads now closed to traffic and an Easy Access Trail. However Burnham Beeches is hilly and so there are some steep slopes in places. There are no stiles and the gates shown on the map are designed to allow wheelchairs and scooters. For those wanting to explore there are many natural “challenging” paths. The map shows types of path, slopes, gates, etc. to help you to decide which paths are suitable for you.

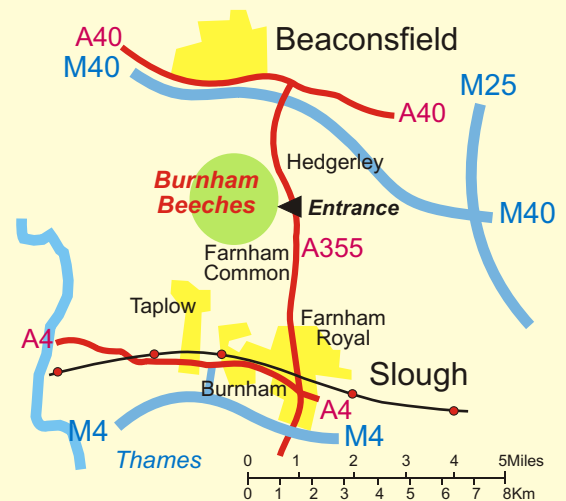
Visitor Information

- Open from 8am until dusk.
- Public and disabled toilets.
- There are two cafes. The one on Hawthorn Lane is open all day, all year with disabled parking, although the café itself is not accessible there are tables outside. The refreshment kiosk on Lord Mayors Drive is open during the summer and winter weekends.
- Dogs are welcome but must be kept under effective control.
- The woods are managed by the Corporation of London. Call 01753 647358 for more information about the woods or to report any problems.

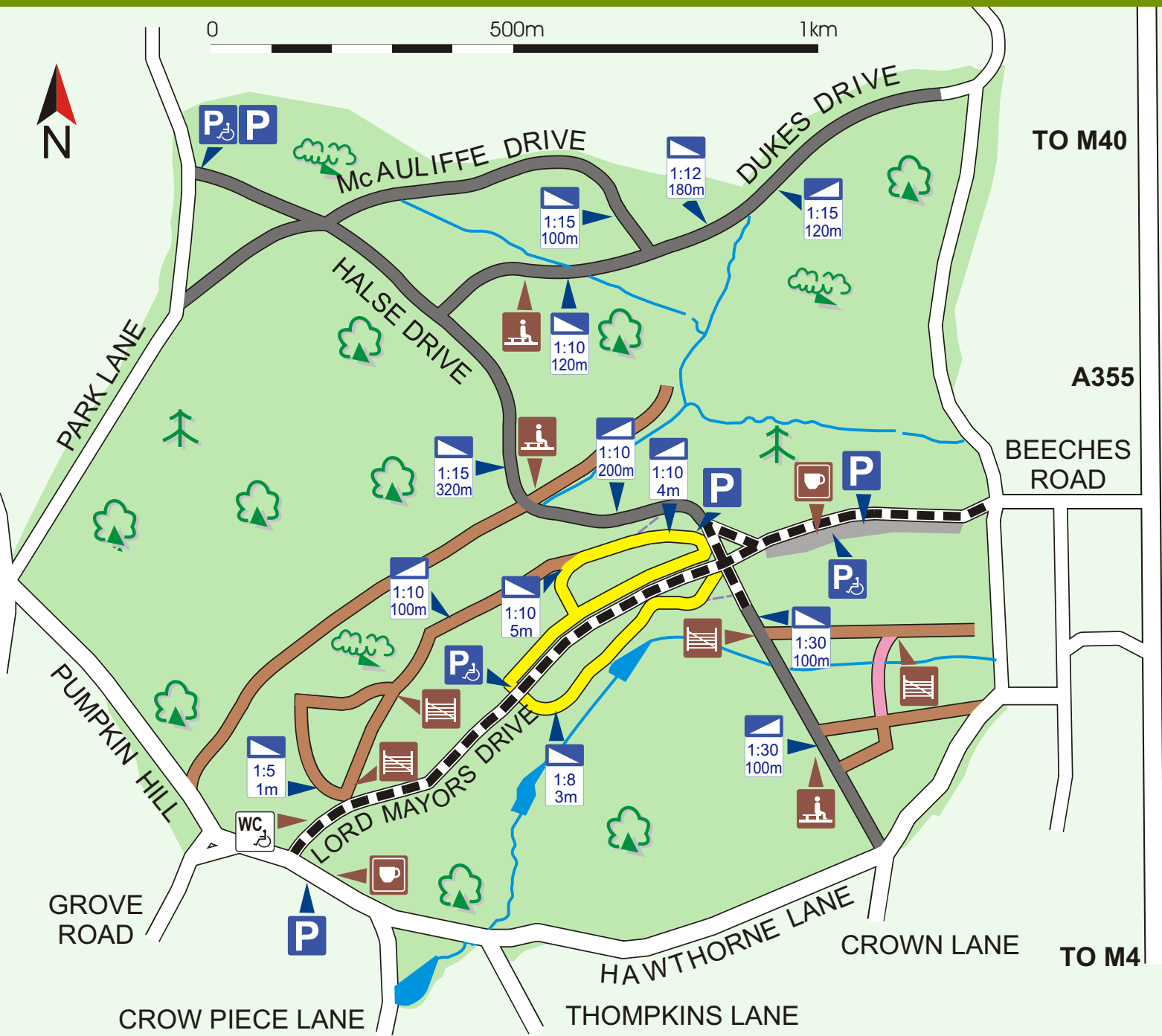

How to get there



Main access from Beeches Road, just off the A355 in Farnham Common. Buses stop in Farnham Common on route between Slough and Beaconsfield. Call 0870 6082608 for bus times.





Path surfaces

- Tarmac road, can be used but beware of vehicles
- Hard smooth path (tarmac)
- Easy Access Trail. Hard surface with occasional loose stones less than 10 mm. Seating at regular intervals.
- Wooden boardwalk. Hard & smooth.
- Natural earth path. Firm but bumpy. Uneven with puddles/mud after rain. Some tree roots or loose stones up to 30 mm
